Greenwich Village: Capture the bohemian spirit of the past and present as you meander through the narrow, tree-lined streets with your guide. You will instantly be caught under its spell. Far removed from the skyscrapers of Midtown, here you'll feel like your in a small town somewhere that's not New York, yet this is probably the most characteristically New York neighborhood of them all! The history of Greenwich Village that is. Cafes, artists, reformers & intellectuals. More has happened here to influence popular culture than perhaps any other neighborhood in the world. You'll LOVE this place. LOTS to discover here.



East Village: With the New Museum opening recently in a previously undesirably section of the neighborhood, it has served as an anchor attracting new galleries and artists. The East Village is the birthplace of punk music and home to more Rock 'n' Roll history than any other neighborhood in New York City. It's also home to the Beatnik movement of the 1950's and has been a home-base for radicals and reformers for the past four decades. Uncover the secrets and find a few other unexpected discoveries in this very diverse, very historic neighborhood.



Lower East Side: New York City was, is and always will be a place where one can come to reinvent oneself. The same is true for the City itself. Once the melting pot of America for new immigrants, this neighborhood is still teeming with new life. This time, the latest incarnation brings a steady stream of new, hip designers and boutiques, restaurants, bars and gathering places, galleries and a young vibrant community. Take a trip into the past as well as discover some of the neighborhoods newer elements.



D.U.M.B.O.: What was once a gritty manufacturing and warehouse district on the waterfront has been transferred into a vibrant and pricey artistic neighborhood. Learn about the local history of this waterfront and discover some of its secrets.



Historic taverns & saloons: Greenwich Village and other neighborhoods in lower Manhattan are choc full of watering holes that have served as incubators for society's free thinkers, reformers and artists. Visit the places where history has been written, literally, and perhaps discover your own inspiration!
